May God bless you and may His love be known to you.

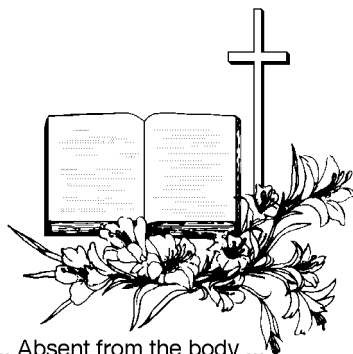

## FIRST READINGS

### 1) "Prayer for the Dead" (2 Maccabees 12:43-46)

A reading from the second book of Maccabees

**Judas, the ruler of Israel, then took up a collection among all his soldiers amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view. For if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin.**

### 3) “A Time for Everything” (Ecclesiastes 3: 1-11)

A reading from the book of Ecclesiastes

**For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter**

a time to plant, and a time to uproot the plant.**

**A time to kill, and a time to heal;  
a time to tear down, and a time to build.**

They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead, and their passing away was thought an affliction, and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace! For if before men, indeed, they be punished, yet is their hope full of immortality. Chastised a little, they shall be greatly blessed, because God tried them and found them worthy of himself. As gold in a furnace, he proved them, and as sacrificial offerings he took them to himself.**

**Those who trust in him shall understand truth, and the faithful shall abide with him in love: Because grace and mercy are with his holy ones, and his care is with his elect.**

A reading from the book of Wisdom

**The Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces. The reproach of his people he will remove from the whole earth, for the Lord has spoken.**

**On that day it will be said, "Behold our God to whom we looked to save us! This is the Lord for whom we looked. Let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us!"**

8) "The Lord Will Bring New Life" (Isaiah 35:3-6, 10)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

**Give strength to hands that are tired and to knees that tremble with weakness. Tell everyone who is discouraged: "Be strong, don't be afraid God is coming to your rescue."**

**The blind will be able to see, and the deaf will hear. The lame will leap and dance, and those who cannot speak will shout for joy. They will reach Jerusalem with gladness, singing and shouting for joy.**

**They will be happy forever, forever free from sorrow, forever free from grief.**

9) "I Will Never Forget You" (Isaiah 49: 8a, 13-16a)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

**Thus says the Lord: "In a time of favor I answer you, on the day of salvation I help you." Sing out, O heavens, and rejoice, O earth! Break forth into song, you mountains. For the Lord comforts his people and shows mercy to his afflicted.**

**But Zion said, "The Lord has forsaken me. The Lord has forgotten me."**

**Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb?**

**Even should she forget, I will never forget you. I have carved you on the palm of my hand.**

10) "Hope In God Will Be Fulfilled" (Lamentations 3:17-26)

A reading from the book of Lamentations

**My soul is deprived of peace. I have forgotten what happiness is. I tell myself my future is lost, all that I hoped for from the Lord.**

**The thought of my homeless poverty is wormwood and gall. Remembering it over and over leaves my soul down-cast within me. But I will call this to mind, as my reason to have hope.**

**The favors of the Lord are not exhausted. His mercies are not spent. They are renewed each morning, so great is his faithfulness.**

**My portion is the Lord, says my soul. Therefore I will hope in him.**

**Good is the Lord to one who waits for him, to the soul that seeks him. It is good to hone in silence for the saving help of the Lord.**

11) "Jesus, "Shepherd" Tends His Flock" (Ezekiel 34: 11-16)

A reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel

**Thus says the Lord God, "I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark.**

**"I myself will pasture my sheep. I myself will give them rest," says the Lord God. "The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, and the sick I will heal, shepherding them rightly."**

12) "Justice Will Prevail" (Daniel 12:1-3)

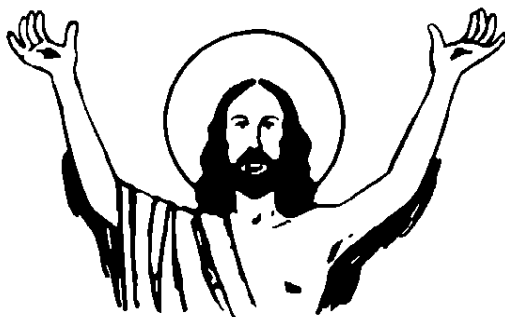
A reading from the book of the prophet Daniel

**I, Daniel, mourned and I heard this word of the Lord:**

**"At that time there shall arise Michael, the great prince, guardian of your people. It shall be a time unsurpassed in distress since nations began until that time. At that time your people shall escape, everyone who is found written in the book.**

**"Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake. Some shall live forever. The wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever.**

## SECOND READINGS

### 1) "God Judges Justly" (Acts 10:34-36, 42-43)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

**Peter proceeded to address the people in these words: "I begin to see how true it is that God shows no partiality. Rather, the man of any nation who fears God and act uprightly is acceptable to him. This is the message he has sent to the sons of Israel, the good news of peace proclaimed through Jesus Christ who is Lord of all. He commissioned us to preach to the people and to bear witness that he is the one set apart by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets testify, saying that everyone who believes in him has forgiveness of sins through his name."**

### 2) "Jesus Saves All Who Trust In Him" (Romans 5:5-11)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

**Hope will not leave us disappointed, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. At the appointed time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for us godless men. It is rare that anyone should lay down his life for a just man, though it is barely possible that for a good man someone may have the courage to die. It is precisely in this that God proves his love for us: that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.**

**Now that we have been justified by his blood, it is all the more certain that we shall be saved by him from God's wrath. For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him by the death of his Son, it is all the more certain that we who have been reconciled will be saved by his life. Not only that. We go so far as to make God our boast through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

### 3) "Eternal Life Comes Through Jesus" (Romans 5:17-21)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

**If death began its reign through one man because of his offense, much more shall those who receive the overflowing grace and gift of justice live and reign through the one man, Jesus Christ.**

**To sum up then, just as a single offense brought condemnation to all men, a single righteous act brought all men acquittal and life. Just as through one man's disobedience all became sinners, so through one man's obedience all shall become just.**

**The law came in order to increase offenses. But despite the increase of sin, grace has far surpassed it, so that as sin reigned through death, grace may reign by way of justice leading to eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.**

### 4) "Let Us Walk In the Newness of Life" (Romans 6:3-4, 8-9)

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

**Are you not aware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Through baptism into his death we were buried with him, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life.**

**If we have died with Christ, we believe that we are also to live with him. We know that Christ, once raised from the dead, will never die again. Death has no more power over him.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

### 5) "We Wait For Our Bodies to Be Set Free" (Romans 8:14-18)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

**All who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the spirit of sonship. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is the Spirit himself bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if we are children, then heirs, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.**

**I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.**

### 6) "The Sufferings of this Present Time" (Romans 8:18-21)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

**The sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

### 7) "Jesus Overcame Suffering & Death" (Romans 8:31b-35, 37-39)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

**If God is for us, who can be against us? Is it possible that he who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for the sake of us all will not grant us all things besides? Who shall bring a charge against God's chosen ones? God, who justifies? Who shall condemn them? Christ Jesus, who died or rather was raised up, who is at the right hand of God and who intercedes for us?**

**Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Trial, or distress, or persecution, or hunger, or nakedness, or danger, or the sword? Yet in all this we are more than conquerors because of him who has loved us. For I am certain that neither death nor life, neither angels nor principalities, neither the present nor the future, nor powers, neither height nor depth nor any other creature, will be able to separate us from the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus, our Lord.**

### 8) "We Belong To The Lord" (Romans 14:7-9, 10b-12)

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

**None of us lives as his own master and none of us dies as his own master. While we live we are responsible to the Lord, and when we die we die as his servants. Both in life and in death we are the Lord's. That is why Christ died and came to life again, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. We shall all have to appear before the judgment seat of God. It is written, "As surely as I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me and every tongue shall give praise to God." Every one of us will have to give an account of himself to God.**

## (Con.) **SECOND READINGS**

### 9) "God's Wisdom Is The Greatest" (1Corinthians 2:1-10)

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

**When I came to you I did not come proclaiming God's testimony with any particular eloquence or wisdom. No, I determined that while I was with you I would speak of nothing but Jesus Christ and him crucified. When I came among you it was in weakness and fear, and with much trepidation. My message and my preaching had none of the persuasive force of wise argumentation, but the convincing power of the Spirit. As a consequence, your faith rests not on the wisdom of men but on the power of God. There is, to be sure, a certain wisdom, which we express among the spiritually mature. It is not a wisdom of this age, however, nor of the rulers of this age, who are men headed for destruction. Of this wisdom it is written, "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it so much as dawned on man what God has prepared for those who love him." Yet God has revealed this wisdom to us through the Spirit.**

### 10) "Christ Will Triumph" (1 Corinthians 15:20-23)

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

**Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first fruits, then, at His coming, those who belong to Christ.**

(Con.) **SECOND READINGS**

11) “Resurrection Will Overcome Death” (1 Corinthians 15:51-57)

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

**Behold, I tell you a mystery. We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. That which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility. That which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality. And when that which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and that which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: “Death is swallowed up in victory.**

**Where, O death, is your victory?**

**Where, O death, is your sting?”**

**The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

12) “We Will Ultimately Live Forever”  
(2 Corinthians 4:14 – 5:1)

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

**We know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with you in his presence. Everything indeed is for you, so that the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people may cause the thanksgiving to overflow for the glory of God.**

**Therefore, we are not discouraged. Rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen. For what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal.**

**For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.**

13) “We Will Come Back To Life” (2 Corinthians 5:1, 6-10)

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

**We know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.**

**So we are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

14) “Our Resurrected Bodies Live Forever”  
(Philippians 3:20-21)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians

**Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body by the power that enables him also to bring all things into subjection to himself.**

The word of the Lord.



15) “Resurrection Follows Death” (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Thessalonians

**We would have you be clear about those who sleep in death, brothers. Otherwise you might yield to grief like those who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, God will bring forth with him from the dead those also who have fallen asleep believing in him.**

**We say to you, as if the Lord himself had said it, that we who live, who survive until his coming, will in no way have an advantage over those who have fallen asleep. No, the Lord himself will come down from heaven at the word of command, at the sound of the archangel's voice and God's trumpet. Those who have died in Christ will rise first. Then we, the living, the survivors, will be caught up with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we shall always be with the Lord unceasingly. Console one another with this message.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

### 16) “We Shall Live With Him” (2 Timothy 2:8-13)

A reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy

**Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David: such is my gospel, for which I am suffering, even to the point of chains, like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore, I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, together with eternal glory. This saying is trustworthy:**

**If we have died with him we shall also live with him.**

**If we persevere we shall also reign with him.**

**But if we deny him, he will deny us.**

**If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself.**

### 17) “Reward For Fidelity” (2 Timothy 4:6-8)

A reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy

**I am already on the point of being sacrificed. The time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing.**

## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

18) "We Are God's Children" (1 John 3:1-2)

A reading from the first letter of John

**See what love the Father has bestowed on us in letting us be called children of God! Yet that in fact is what we are. The reason the world does not recognize us is that it never recognized the Son.**

**Dearly beloved, we are God's children now. What we shall later be has not yet come to light. We know that when it comes to light we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.**

19) "If We Love We Will Have Eternal Life"  
(1 John 3:14-16)

A reading from the first letter of John

**We know that we have passed from death to life because we love our brothers. Whoever does not love remains in death. Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life remaining in him. The way we came to know love was that Jesus laid down his life for us. So we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers.**

20) "Good Works Are Rewarded" (Revelation 14:13)

A reading from the book of Revelation

**I heard a voice from heaven say, "Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on."**

**"Yes," said the Spirit, "let them find rest from their labors, for their works accompany them."**

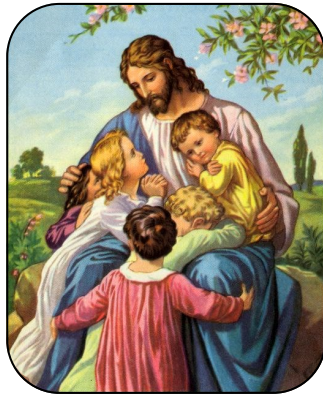
## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

21) “God Will Judge Justly” (Revelation 20:11 – 21:1)

A reading from the book of Revelation

**I saw a large white throne and the one who was sitting on it. The earth and the sky fled from his presence and there was no place for them. I saw the dead, the great and the lowly, standing before the throne, and scrolls were opened. Then another scroll was opened, the book of life. ## (Con.) SECOND READINGS

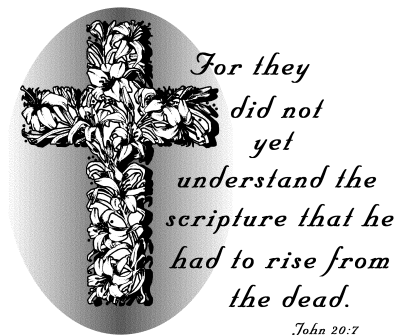
22) "There Will Be No More Death"

I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, no more wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away." Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him.**

**"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart, and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."**

3) Matthew 25: 31-40 "Come, You Who Are Blessed"

**Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.' "**



## (Con.) GOSPEL READINGS

### 4) Luke 7:1 1-17 "Resurrection To The Young"

**Jesus journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. As he drew near to the gate of the city, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. A large crowd from the city was with her. When the Lord saw her, he was moved with pity for her and said to her, "Do not weep." He stepped forward and touched the coffin. At this the bearers halted, and he said, "Young man, I tell you, arise!" The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, exclaiming, "A great prophet has arisen in our midst," and "God has visited his people." This report about him spread through the whole of Judea and in all the surrounding region.**



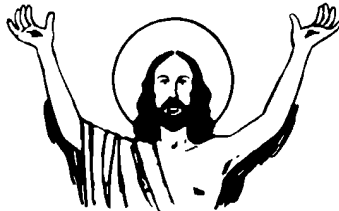
### 5) Luke 23: 33, 39-43 "You Will Be With Me In Paradise"

**When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified Jesus and the criminals there, one on his right, the other on his left. Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."**

## (Con.) GOSPEL READINGS

6) John 5: 24-29 "Those Who Hear His Voice Will Live"

**Jesus said to the Jews: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes in the one who sent me has eternal life and will not come to condemnation, but has passed from death to life. Amen, amen, I say to you, the hour is coming and is now here when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. For just as the Father has life in himself, so also he gave to his Son the possession of life in himself. And he gave him power to exercise judgment, because he is the Son of Man. Do not be amazed at this, because the hour is coming in which all who are in the tombs will hear his voice and will come out, those who have done good deeds to the resurrection of life, but those who have done wicked deeds to the resurrection of condemnation."**



7) John 6: 37-40 "If We Believe In Jesus We Shall Live"

**Jesus said to the crowd: "Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me. And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day."**

## (Con.) GOSPEL READINGS

8) John 6: 51-58 “Anyone Who Eats This Bread Will Live”

**Jesus said to the crowd: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."**

**The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."**

9) John 11:17-27 “I Am The Resurrection And The Life”

**When Jesus arrived in Bethany he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."**

## (Con.) GOSPEL READINGS

10) John 12: 23-28 “Unless A Grain Of Wheat Falls”

**Jesus told his disciples, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me."**

**"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."**



11) John 14: 1-6 “Many Rooms In My Father’s House”

**Jesus said to his disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God, have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."**

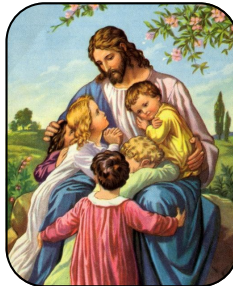

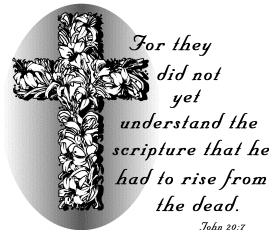
